To go to the Rugby Village

In the direction of the Prairie des Filtres.
Use public transport or go by bike

By metro

- Line A – station: *Saint-Cyprien - République* (then an 8-min walk)
- Line A – station: *Esquirol* (then an 11-min walk)

By tram

- Line T1 – stop: *Fer à Cheval*

By bus

- Lines 14, 45 and 66 – stop : Saint-Cyprien

Lines 13 – stop Saint-Cyprien and 44 – stop Pont Neuf in addition, on non-match days in Toulouse

By bike

Located in the city centre, the Rugby Village is accessible from anywhere in Toulouse via many cycle paths, cycle lanes and tracks dedicated to non-motorised vehicles.

THE HIGHLIGHTS*

8 SEPTEMBER

- 2 p.m.: the Village doors open. Many family-friendly activities await!
- 4 p.m.: Concert**
- 8 p.m.: interactive activities, presentation of the teams and flags, and a giant round of applause leading up to the countdown to kick-off,
- 9 p.m.: the France - New Zealand match kicks off,
- After the match, and in a major first for Toulouse, watch the Rugby Drone Show; a display of 200 drones accompanied by a DJ set.

9 SEPTEMBER: RUGBY FESTIVAL

- From 11 a.m. to 8 p.m.: rugby schools from Haute-Garonne will gather to play each other on the beach rugby pitch.

10 SEPTEMBER

- 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.: a Japanese drum show with the group Paris Taiko Ensemble.

THE STADIUM

To go to the stadium

It is on the Île du Ramier.

Use public transport or go by bike.

BY BIKE

- Bicycle parking area with 1,000 spaces in front of Nakache swimming pool. Guarded and free of charge, open 24 hours a day.
- Bicycle parking area with 300 spaces close to the *Passerelle de la Poudrerie (Chemin de la Loge)*. Guarded and free of charge, open 24 hours a day.

BY TRAM

- Line T1 – stop: *Croix de Pierre*

BY BUS

- Linéo 4 and 5, lines 34, 44 and 152 - stop : Empalot

BY METRO

- Line B – stop: *Saint-Michel Marcel-Langer* or *Empalot*

BY SHUTTLE BUS

A special shuttle bus will enable fans with a ticket to park at the Zenith carpark (11 Av. Raymond Badiou) and be dropped off as close as possible to the Stadium.

Access is also possible via the *Toulouse Matabiau*, *Saint-Agne* and *Saint-Cyprien-Arènes* train stations, which link up with metro lines A and B.

An inclusive and sustainable festival
In order to be accessible to all audiences, an audio description of the matches is available at the Stadium. This audio description is also available at the Rugby Village when France is playing, along with sensory refuges and vibrating vests for the concert.
